power of the human spirit. They also learned that even in the most difficult of circumstances, there is always hope.



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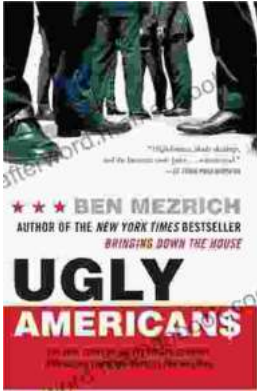
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
